# Dispensary

- Very well regulated with Dispense it software.
- No onsite Pharmacist or Pharmacy technician.
- Mostly for repeat dispensing, therefore less need for counselling as most patients have been on the same medication for a long period.
- Ordering repeat prescriptions.
- Good staff
