- Range of clinics




Who I worked with

- Practice nurse and nurse team
- Practice manager
- Prescription and Registration Team
- Reception



Activities

- Shadowing all members
- Discussing systems in place
- Shadowing and participating in consultations
- Holding my own consultations, call in GP at the end for prescription





Consultation Skills

- Urine dip sticks
- BP
- Temperatures
- ENT examinations
- Peak flow tests
- O2 sats
- Pulse





Why this was important

- Discussed barriers between pharmacy and surgeries
- GP surgeries already overworked
- Role for pharmacists in GP surgery
- Shown how pharmacists can make time
- Shortage of GPs
- Pharmacists are cheaper than GPs



Future

- Pharmacists could hold medication reviews
- Pharmacists could hold minor ailments clinics
- Prescribing pharmacists
- Next to other HCPs if necessary



Could lead to...

- Reduced waiting times
- More appointments
- Save money for the NHS
- More jobs for pharmacists
- Less pressure on GPs



Improvements

- Earlier communication between GP and project
- Move placement away from exam
